Our school has 3 main priorities

1. Collaborative response

Model is team of teachers come together every 4-5 weeks to develop strategies to support the majority of students

Teachers from same grade level meet to come up with strategies as they often have solutions from experiencing what has been successful.

Teachers bring issues forward (i.e. kids finish work early but not good work), Teachers Brainstorm how to deal with issue

They find out other strategies other teachers are doing

List created 2-3 things that they are committed to trying

High impact strategies are reviewed and how they worked

Have gone one step further this year, Gr. 3 teachers meet, but Gr. 4 teacher may have same issue. A Playbook is being created to share strategies.

Out of collaborative team meetings structured document is created and available across all grade levels.

Organically teachers began to use Thursday afternoons to workshop development of the strategies.

We find better follow through with peer involvement

2. Visible learning

shown in demo of learning – related to success criteria as learning goals are given

3. Targeted learning in classroom

Assistance available for speech behaviour, students with specific IPP come out of classrooms to work with specific targeted learning, EA's able to have dedicated time to specific students.

Budgets have specific allocations, which have not scaled with the increase in diverse student requirements.

Division has been watching the program at our school with good reason

Restorative practice—when we have to discipline students, most important part is to have students work through the restorative process

i.e. student conflict, students are brought together and asked questions, student who wash harmed and who caused harm, hear the answers to the questions, "how it felt"

this has reduced suspension

even with suspensions there is an educational component i.e. Ms Ulgar has a google classroom piece with racism component that has to be worked through

Curriculum is Changing (Science, Social), need to review of recommended steps

Mental Health Survey

School vs entire division

Statistically significant yellow is lower than division, but may be only .1, division uses 10 as a marker we use 5

Survey question: I know where to find mental health resources

- -normally low in the division
- -not sure what else we can do
- -inside the school we talk about resources (kids help line)
- -looking for ideas how to broadcast resources
- -school councillor Mr Nav, helps link families

Morin: are there specific websites available for certain issues, can we promote the websites

Andriana: one item is kids kickstand website that has mental health resources

-Kids Help Line is an external resource, they do have a text option,

Brian: kids don't realize that it has to be a serious issue, can be for medium issues

Maria: resource just for students to talk about simple issues

Morin: need to be able to scan a barcode (gr code) to access services

Survey question: Is there and adult in my school that I am comfortable talking to

- -Mr Nav is the main resource, though some students talk to the custodian
- -continually working on helping students find a trusted adult in the building

Gr. 5-7

Better results in Junior High, nothing in the 5 range or above

Comparison of the past two years

Questions of focus:

Do Teachers help me find strategies to cope with my feelings?

Does the school help create activities that support my mental health?

Might be the language, i.e. recess, breaks, snacks are all part of mental health, well being in general is part of mental health

In finding resources, they might not connect the resources and strategies that have been promoted

Time sis pent on racism awareness, autism, videos

We know good things are happening, but they are not making connections to the wording in the question

Shanley: Survey in school don't match the experience we witness at the school

Results have gone down but still better than division
